EMT Class Rules 2012

1. Chapters must be read prior to class. Participation in class activities is required.
2. Students must complete 10 hours of clinical time prior to 06-10-12. The ten hours may be spent with a licensed EMS transport agency. A minimum of three patient contacts and transports must be documented on the appropriate forms. Students may also pull their 10 hours in an emergency room located in the CSEMS region.
3. Students are responsible to schedule their own clinical time. The instructor will be notified in advance of the clinical schedule.
4. No personal phone calls during class except in an emergency. No pagers, cellular phones or other communication devices are to be on during class unless approval from the instructor.
5. No one is to attend class or clinical rotations under the influence of any mind altering substance.
6. Horseplay or disruptive behavior will not be tolerated. Equipment will be cared for properly and any intentional damage to equipment will result in replacement of the equipment at the student's expense and termination from the class.
7. Module test must be passed with a minimal score of at least 70%. Failure of a module test will result in taking a makeup test and passing it with a score of at least 80%. Makeup tests must be taken within one week of the original test.
8. Students are expected to keep the meeting rooms clean after use. Equipment will be put away in the proper order after each class.
9. Smoking will be allowed in the designated areas during break.
10. Students will sign in on attendance sheet each day to receive credit for attending class. Material missed must be made up to the satisfaction of the instructor. This includes taking any quiz or test on your first class back. Classes start promptly at 18:30 hours unless otherwise indicated on the syllabus. No more than 15 hours of class instruction can be missed to be able to take the state exam.
11. Students must attend class on their assigned schedule. Any changes must be approved in advance by the instructor(s) in order for class time to count.
12. Tardiness to class or from breaks will not be tolerated.
13. Cancellation of class will be made no later than 2 hours prior to class.
14. No class fees will be refunded after the first class.
15. Problems within the class must be taken to the instructors for resolution. If the problem can't be resolved to your satisfaction, you will be directed to the Va. Office of EMS for final resolution.
16. Emergency calls during class must be answered. The instructor will send appropriate manpower to handle calls. No one is to leave without instructor approval.
17. Cheating or falsifying documents will not be tolerated. Suspicion or proof of this will result in immediate termination from the class.
